Johanna Bergfelt, a native of Sweden, graduated from The Royal Swedish Ballet School in 1989. She has an extensive performance background beginning with Östgötabaletten, where she worked for six years. Since coming to Canada in 2000, Johanna has worked with numerous choreographers, and she was a company dancer with Pro Arte Danza and the Toronto Dance Theatre. As a teacher, Johanna teaches regularly at The Citadel, In Studio, Dance Arts Institute, The Dance Institute, company classes at Toronto Dance Theatre, as well as her own online classes. Since 2022 she has worked as a dancer and rehearsal director for Citadel + Compagnie.



Valerie Calam is a dance artist interested in finding pathways to refresh and support herself. She works with movement, fabric, patterns, sound, numbers, the nervous system, the body, and likes to edit/adapt/repurpose things. Val enjoys working alongside dancers, artists & queer creatives and has a long history as a performer, teacher and choreographer in Toronto. She is the Membership Coordinator & Operations Manager for CADA/East (Canadian Alliance of Dance Artists-East Chapter). She completed a Master of Fine Arts Degree in Choreography in 2014 at York U and is the recipient of the KM Hunter Award for dance.



Roberto Campanella born and raised in Rome, trained at the Scuola Italiana di Danza Contemporanea. Joining Compagnia Italiana di Danza Contemporanea in 1985 and later Aterballetto, he advanced to Soloist at The National Ballet of Canada in 1993, excelling in classical and contemporary roles. Debuting choreographically at The National Ballet's 1995 Workshop, he later graduated with distinction from the National Ballet School's Teacher Training Program. A renowned guest teacher, Campanella is acclaimed for his choreography, notably for ProArteDanza. Nominated for the Bonnie Bird Choreography Award and recipient of the Fellowship Initiative Award, he premiered "Alice in Wonderland" in 2008, garnering a Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding Choreography. Today, he's a sought-after choreographer/director for film/TV, contributing to acclaimed productions like "The Strain" and the Oscar winner film, "The Shape of Water."



Dominique Dumais received her dance training at Canada's National Ballet School in Toronto. After graduating in 1986, she joined the National Ballet of Canada, was promoted to soloist, dancing in both the classical and contemporary repertoire. From 2002 to 2016, she held the position of inhouse choreographer and deputy director of the dance department at National Theater Mannheim, where she worked closely with artistic director Kevin O'Day. Since 2018, Dominique has been the artistic director and house choreographer of the dance company at Mainfranken Theater Würzburg, Germany. She has choreographed over 45 pieces, including eleven full-length works for the National theatre Mannheim, Germany. Since taking up

her post in Würzburg, she has choreographed works such as Mothertongue (2019), Alice in Wonderland (2022), Chaplin (2023), Four Seasons (2023), Eros (2024), and most recently, Classic Soul (2024). Dominique has been commissioned by the National Ballet of Canada, Ballet British Columbia, Les Ballets Jazz de Montréal, Alberta Ballet, American Repertory Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Het National Ballet in Amsterdam, the Komische Oper in Berlin, Gauthier Dance in Stuttgart, Ballett Augsburg, and Tanzcompany Gießen, among others. As well as choreographing for several film projects, she has been three times nominated for the Canadian Dora Mavor Moore Award.



Robert Glumbek graduated from Bytom State Ballet School in Poland and joined the Great Theatre of Opera and Ballet in Warsaw as a soloist. He immigrated to Canada, danced with many companies and later joined Mannheim Ballett as a dancer and ballet master. He is a choreographer, the Artistic Associate for ProArteDanza and faculty member of Toronto Metropolitan University. Robert has choreographed numerous acclaimed works for companies around the world. He was a finalist in the Hanover and Stuttgart Choreographic Competitions, recipient of the Now Magazine Best Dancer, K.M. Hunter Artist Award and Clifford E. Lee Choreography Award. Robert is a Dora Mavor Moore nominee and winner and was twice presented the Jan Kiepura Choreographer award in Poland.



Eric Hall has performed professionally with ballet companies across Canada and continues to inspire through his established teaching practice in Toronto. As a Registered Massage Therapist, he approaches ballet technique and teaching with an anatomical expertise that enables his students to dance safely and to their best potential. His classes are renown for their musicality, flow, and choreographic elements that give students the feeling of truly dancing.



Martha Hart is a Dora-nominated dance artist, choreographer and educator based in Tkaronto/Toronto. She is a graduate of Canada's National Ballet School, Palucca Schule Dresden, L'ecole Superieure du Ballet de Quebec, and Arts Umbrella Dance. After an engagement with the Dresden Semperoper Ballet in Germany, she returned to Canada in 2010 and has since worked with Cote Danse, Human Body Expression, TranscenDance Project, Aeris Korper, AceDance Theatre, The Garage, Hit & Run Dance Productions, Mascall Dance, Broadbent Sisters, Project20 in Montreal, Vancouver and Toronto. From 2015-2016 she toured Mexico, Spain and Italy

as a member of the Metamorphosis Dance Collective directed by Iratxe Ansa and Igor Bacovich and produced Metamorphosis Method Workshops in Toronto from 2017 to 2020. In 2020, she founded hART dance to act as a collaborative umbrella for her choreographic endeavours. Her work has been featured in the music video 'Mutual Friend' by Canadian artist Jessey Reyez, Stackt Market, Nuit Blanche and "Oasis" (a short film through the Canadian Film Centre).



One of Canada's most celebrated dance artists, **Greta Hodgkinson** was a Principal Dancer with The National Ballet of Canada for over 24 years. She performed every leading classical role and originated many works by renowned choreographers. Her international guest appearances span 72 cities across 16 countries. Appointed to the Order of Ontario in 2017, she continues to influence dance through coaching and mentorship. In 2021, she founded Dance Mentoring by Greta, a unique program guiding emerging artists. She is currently Artist in Residence at The National Ballet of Canada, where she leads the RBC Apprentice Program and mentors professional dancers worldwide.



Ryan Lee is a dance artist whose versatile roles encompass choreographer, performer, rehearsal director, educator, and mentor. Graduating from TMU with a Bachelor of Fine Arts, he has been fortunate to have worked with such companies as Human Body Expression, ProArteDanza, TDT, Kaeja d'Dance, Anandam Dancetheatre, inDANCE, The Chimera Project, Frog in Hand and Transcendance Project.Ryan is the current Co-Rehearsal Director for Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre. He has been commissioned to make choreographic works by ProArteDanza, Anandam DanceTheatre, Toronto Metropolitan University, Dance Arts Institute, Centennial College, George Brown College, The Emerging Artist Intensive, Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre, Etobicoke School for the Arts, Cawthra Park, and Rosedale School of the Performing Arts. Ryan's work has been presented at festivals such as Dance Ontario Dance Weekend,SummerWorks and will be a part of Dance: Made IN Canada Festival, summer 2025.



Sasha Ludavicius is a professional Contemporary dance artist and teacher in Toronto. In 2016, she graduated from the School of Toronto Dance Theatre and started working for the ProArteDanza Company during their 2015 season. She has had the opportunity to dance with Peggy Baker Dance Projects, Red Sky Performance, The Chimera Project and the Hit&Run Dance Productions. Ludavicius has been the Training Manager and Rehearsal Director for the ProArteDanza's Summer Intensive Program (SIP) since 2020. Additionally, she rehearsal directed for The Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre during their 2022 Season. She has been on the faculty for the National Ballet of Canada's

In-Studio Summer Dance Intensive for the past 3 years and has taught Contemporary in their adult program. This past year she offered Contemporary dance workshops and choreographed in performing art high schools across Toronto. Her passion for movement influenced her in becoming a Pilates instructor, fitness trainer as well as a certified Yoga/Barre instructor and flexibility coach.



Natasha Poon Woo is a Dora Award-winning dancer and freelance artist based in Toronto who frequents the stage with companies including Rock Bottom Movement, Côté Danse, and Compagnie de la Citadelle. She has been a guest teacher for companies and institutions such as the Limón Dance Company, Toronto Dance Theatre, The Fifth, ProArteDanza's SIP, and performing arts schools across the GTA, in addition to her 12+ years of rehearsal directing experience with Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre and Human Body Expression, among others. Natasha is a proud alumna of CCDT, SUNY Purchase's Conservatory of Dance, and Codarts: Rotterdam Dance Academy.



Kelly Shaw is a BFA honours graduate of TMU, and recipient of the University's 2018 Jack McAllister award. She is a Tkarón:to/Toronto-based free-lance artist, collaborating with several Toronto based dance companies over the past 15 years, including but not limited to; ProArte Danza, Cote Danse, Human Body Expression, Transcendance Project, Alysa Pires Dance Projects and Frog in Hand. She is a 2010, 2018 and 2024 Dora Mavor Moore nominee. Kelly has toured internationally to perform and rehearsal direct, most recently in 2024 to Seoul, Korea, Luxemburg and Wurtzburg, Germany. Kelly is a sought after dance educator (currently on faculty at TMU), and a choreographer across North America. She also works in Film and Television; choreographing lately for Brilliant Minds (NBC), How to Die Alone (Hulu) and Star Trek (Strange New Worlds). Additionally she is an actor, pilates and barre instructor, and certified life coach.



Eleanor van Veen is a dance artist from Cape Breton Island, now based in Toronto, where she collaborates, performs, and teaches dance and Pilates. Driven by a desire for intuitive movement, her practice is an ever-evolving exploration of flow and feeling. Eleanor has performed works by Alysa Pires, Hanna Kiel, Lesley Telford, Meghann Michalsky, Naishi Wang, Nicole von Arx, Syreeta Hector, among others, and has worked with Edmonton Opera, Human Body Expression, Metamorphosis Dance, Near & Far Projects, Nostos Collectives, ProArteDanza, and Project InTandem. As a creator, Eleanor has shared and explored her work in settings including Woodland Farm's Artist Residency, Kinetic's Open Studio Series, Art & Water's Dockside Dance, and St. Elizabeth's Regional Arts Program.



Born in Tkaronto/Toronto, **Jera Wolfe** is a choreographer and performer and a member of the Manitoba Métis Federation. His captivating choreography has awarded him the 2019 Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding Original Choreography for Trace by Red Sky Performance. He has demonstrated an impressive repertoire of works presented by Canadian Stage, National Arts Centre, Fall For Dance North, Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity, Festival des arts de Saint-Sauveur, Citadel + Compagnie, Danse Danse, and Jacob's Pillow. As aperformer Jera has danced for Red Sky Performance as well as Peggy Baker Dance Projects. He is also the lead performer in PISUWIN with Atlantic Ballet.
